Dr. Tang has been well trained in all areas of general otolaryngology. He has completed subspecialty training in Endoscopic Sinus Surgery and Skull Base Surgery with particular interests including chronic rhinosinusitis, nasal polyps, nasal obstruction, CSF leak, nasal tumors, proptosis, and excessive tearing.
