Dr. Tang is a fellowship-trained sinus and skull base surgeon and is part of the Beverly Hills Sinus Center. Dr. Tang has a particular interest in chronic sinusitis, nasal polyposis, sinonasal tumors, endoscopic skull base surgery, and hereditary hemorrhagic telangiectasia. His goal is to perform surgery that optimizes further medical management to optimize patients' quality of life. He also has a passion for treating complex skull base disorders such as pituitary tumors, cerebrospinal fluid leaks, chordomas, and benign and malignant tumors of the nose, sinuses, nasopharynx, and orbit. These challenging cases are often handled in collaboration with physicians from multiple other specialties to ensure the best possible outcome.
