Diana Bell, M.D., is a clinical professor in the Department of Pathology at City of Hope. She completed her anatomic pathology residency at Stony Brook New York State University with subsequent fellowships in oncologic surgical pathology and head and neck pathology at MD Anderson Cancer Center.

Prior to her training, Dr. Bell completed an immunology postdoctoral fellowship in the field of dendritic cells and cancer vaccines. She is a member of several professional organizations, including North American Head and Neck Society, European Society for Pathology and Head and Neck Working Group, American Head and Neck Society, North American Skull Base Society, American Association for Cancer Research.

A dedicated head and neck pathologist, Dr. Bell's research interest focuses on sinonasal and salivary gland tumors. The aim of her research is to find and apply new strategies and technologies to better understand key molecular changes during the pathogenesis of head and neck cancers, with emphasis on salivary gland and sinonasal tumors. Dr. Bell is a member of the WHO 2016 Consensus and Editorial Study Section of Head and Neck Tumors.
