

Dr. Katayoun Omrani is a board certified Orofacial Pain specialist at the Headache, Orofacial Pain and Sleep Apnea Program at the Cedars-Sinai Pain Center. She is also a fellow of American Academy of Orofacial Pain.

Dr. Omrani's area of expertise include the diagnosis and treatment for chronic painful conditions in the head, face, neck and temporomandibular joint such as:

- Headaches- acute and chronic migraine headaches, chronic daily headaches, tension-type [L] [SEP] headaches, medication overuse headaches, cluster headaches, hemicrania continua, hypnic [L] [SEP] headaches, SUNCT and other primary headaches
- Temporomandibular joint (TMJ) disorders- jaw pain, jaw noises, limited oral range of motion
- Muscular pain-myofascial pain, myalgia, trismus and spasm [L] [SEP]
- Facial neuropathic pain- post herpetic neuralgia, burning mouth syndrome and other [L] [SEP] trigeminal neuropathic disorders! [L] [SEP]
- Trigeminal neuralgia and other painful neuralgias such as glossopharyngeal neuralgia and [L] [SEP] nervous intermedius neuralgia [L] [SEP]
- Occipital neuralgia [L] [SEP]
- Atypical facial pain! [L] [SEP]
- Neck pain

- She also assists patients with sleep apnea and snoring who cannot tolerate CPAP machine with dental devices
